Milestone Ministries at Our Savior By: Dave Wright



The 2017-2018 school year began on August 23rd with opening worship led by Pastor Wangelin and Vicar Weeks. With 167 K-8th grade students this year, we have the most grade school students enrolled since we relocated to St. Joe Hwy/Broadbent in 2008. Through daily Bible study and prayer, service and leadership opportunities, our school family will engage in Christian witness in and beyond Our Savior Lutheran School.
