Linger Longer: Resting in the Word By: Dave Wright

The OSL Women's Fall Retreat (October 5-7, at Haworth Inn, Holland, MI) is called Linger Longer: Resting in the Word. Our ladies will be led by Pat Maier, and she will introduce and encourage the concept of Bible journaling and visual faith. Pat was one of four artists to contribute work for the Enduring Word Bible.



In Pat's own words from The Word Endures CPH blog, she writes, "The Enduring Word Bible, or any journaling Bible, provides extra margin space for putting pen to page while reading God's Word. The process is simple: you read,

you pause to reflect on the passage or verse, and then you respond by writing a portion of Scripture, an expression of faith, or a prayer in the margin. Taking extra time to add an illustration or color to your lettering adds to the meditation time and provides a picture in your mind to take with you through the day. I have found that by slowing down, I am more likely to have the Word ready to share with others as God presents opportunities in my daily life to reach out. It also

creates a kind of faith story of my life and becomes a legacy to leave behind for my family.

Bible journaling isn't rocket science, but it is supported by educational research. Since about 70% of people are visual, kinesthetic, or tactile learners, educators wisely



provide pictures, flash cards, and hands-on activities to help children learn in school. Bible journaling is simply applying these techniques to help us learn and remember God's Word.

Even if you don't think you're artistic or creative, give it a try. Bible journaling may not be for everyone, but everyone can benefit from a different perspective and meditating on the Word of God. The new Enduring Word Bible provides space for this in the two-inch margins of each page. Lines in the margins make it easy to journal notes and prayers or create lettering art and images. And if you like to color but hesitate to add your own pictures, there are over 350 hand-drawn Scripture illustrations included in the Bible."

Food Bank - Did You Know

Did you know that in Ingham County there are almost 45,000 Individuals, 11,680 being children, who are food-insecure? So far this year, the food bank has served 6,137 individuals within 1,674 family units.

The food bank operates under the direction of Sharon Miller with many volunteers who unload trucks, organize pantry shelves, assist clients, and so much more. They are also there to lend a listening ear to anyone who needs it and glorify God through serving others.

Not only does the food bank provide much needed groceries, but they are also one of just a few food banks that provides personal care items, gently used clothing and household goods.

God-sightings abound at the food bank. Sharon Miller recalls, "We had a client come in who received her food and then mentioned that her son wanted to play baseball but she couldn't afford cleats. I led her over to the free room and together we looked through the shoes. Sitting there were a pair of cleats, donated the week before, that just happened to be her son's shoe size."

Donations are always welcomed at the food bank. Any non-perishable food items, personal care items, gently used clothing or kitchen/household goods are welcome.
