As one ministry ends, another is beginning. The Early Childhood staff are all looking forward to welcoming our new students, and also to welcoming back our returning students! Our teachers and staff have been hard at work preparing their classrooms, conducting home visits, and praying for our incoming families. As of this week, we are close to full in all three classrooms – what a blessing! We are looking forward to the faith formation and learning to come in our classrooms.



The Mission Continues in South Africa

Our partner church and school in Middelburg, South Africa, is confident in the Lord's blessing and provision as they struggle to learn, live, and share Christ in a pandemic.

We received a beautiful thank you note from the Cedrick Hannay Children's Home (orphanage) in Middelburg, signed by the children, and including their picture. OSL sent a memorial gift in memory of Pastor Khumalo last spring (over \$10,000) which helped sustain the orphanage, St. Peter Confessional Lutheran Church, their preschool, grade school, and high school.

In mid-July, the government shut down the country for four weeks in the third wave of the pandemic. The church and school were closed during that time but have since reopened. Civil unrest broke out in August, and riots affected major cities, including Middelburg. Our African brothers and sisters have endured much hardship, but they have an unshakable resolve to follow Jesus, seek the Lord, and share the Gospel with more and more people. Whatever the real and underlying causes are of so much turmoil, the real problem is sin, and the solution is the grace and forgiveness we have in Jesus Christ.

Leaders from Middelburg will be visiting Our Savior in late September. Pastor Wangelin and three others from Lansing will be traveling to Middelburg in November to work with our partners, assess the needs of the ministry, and affirm our love and concern for them. Lord willing, we will plan a mission trip of OSL members to South Africa in June 2022.
