

meant to be an ongoing practice, not a 'one and done' event. Maybe you picked up the Bible Reading plan and





At the end of our 10:30am service, we invite children to come up by our praise band, and play instruments, throw streamers in the air, make a joyful noise to the Lord, and move and groove. For me, it is one of my favorite parts of our 10:30 service.

Now what if we had an entire service like that?

This Spring, we are launching a new worship opportunity called, "Connect." It will take place in the School Commons, starting at 10:30ish, running at the same time as our 10:30 worship service in the sanctuary. We are planning three pilot services this spring. Our three services will be on April 16th, May

7th, and June 4th. After those three services, we will evaluate the

response and see how often we will run this service starting in September 2023.

Our vision for the

Connect service is: To provide young families, and others, with an informal, interactive and connecting worship experience. This service, held in the School



Commons, will be designed for young families, and involve various areas for participation for all ages. This service will have a balance of celebration, reverence, and a relaxed worship where families can worship and receive Word and Sacrament in a meaningful and powerful way.

Here at Our Savior, we love having children in all our worship services. We won't stop the instruments at the end of the 10:30 service in the sanctuary, and we won't make all children go to the School Commons during worship. This new Connect service will be a new and different worship opportunity. While it may be geared toward a young family demographic, that does not mean it is only for young families.

We and other churches have noticed that following the pandemic, young families have had the hardest time returning to worship. Whether it is because of health concerns, parents unsure of how children will act in a large group, or whatever it may be, we want to help young families have an opportunity to have meaningful worship together. We also have a great mission opportunity with the young families connected to our Early Childhood and Summer Camp programs. Is there a young family you could invite to connect with God and fellow Christians in this service?

Sunday morning provides an opportunity to

They were in amazement at how loud and awesome the chant was. At that moment I told the boys how special this moment was. I still get chills sharing this experience.
