## A Lesson on Love and Hate (3:11-12)

1 John 3:11 "This is the message you heard from the beginning..." (note 1:5)

The account of Cain and Abel is found in Genesis 4. Abel brought an offering to the Lord from his flocks, and Cain brought an offering from the field. God looked with favor on Abel's offering but on Cain's He did not. And so Cain was angry and downcast, and plotted to kill his brother.
