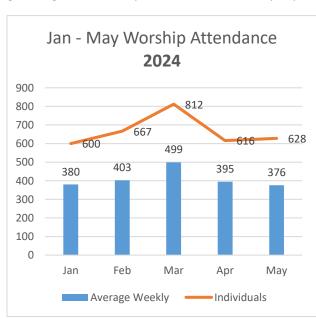
Learn Live Share Christ

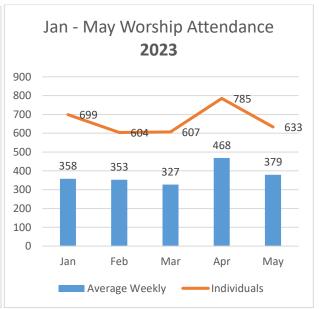

What a joy it was to hear stories, see the connections made, and see how God is at work in our communities! Jesus is on the loose and working in Lansing, let's join him on Team Jesus!

One host reported, "It was great meeting neighbors (for the first time) that lived right down the road. One said they were embarrassed that they hadn't done it sooner, but glad this event brought us together. Many connections were made. Good discussions were had about things to do in the community together."

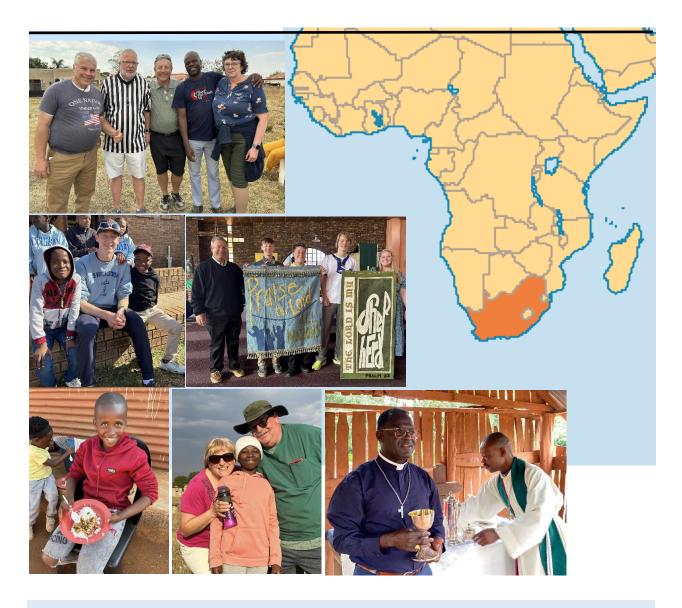




Onyx the Ministry Dog

African Mission Partners 2024-25

We continue to be richly blessed by the partnership we have with our brothers and sisters in Middelburg, South Africa and with Pastor and Alice Dangba of Living Word Lutheran, Lansing.

- Pastor Moses and Alice Dangba traveled to Uganda and South Sudan on a mission trip, delivering supplies, encouraging the people in refugee camps, and opening Living Word Orphanage. OSL volunteers made many of the supplies and gathered for a sending prayer.
- Applications for 2025 South Africa Mission Team with Deposit due October 1, 2024.
- Vicar Given Masemola will be ordained on November 3, 2024 at St. Peter Confessional Lutheran Church in Middelburg. Efforts are still being made to bring him for a year of study at Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne with OSL as his sponsor.

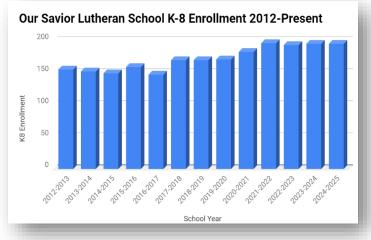
